The Colorado Council of Professional Archaeologists (CCPA) is pleased to announce a scholarship opportunity for Spring 2024 available to Native American students pursuing degrees and training in anthropology, archaeology, museum, or other cultural studies. CCPA Native American Scholarships (NAS) are awarded to promote high standards of archaeological research, reporting, site management, and other studies in cultural and historic preservation.

Up to \$1,500.00 will be awarded to one or two Native American graduate or undergraduate students. Eligibility and opportunities include:

- Students enrolled in an accredited Anthropology, Ethnography, or Museum Studies Program
- Funding for archaeological field school preferably in Colorado or offered through a Colorado college or university
- THPO, NAGPRA, NEPA, NHPA (Section 106) or historic preservation training certification, or internships

Applications are due April 25, 2024!
